A20 Improvement Scheme







Background


Together with Dover District Council, the Port of Dover is delivering a key road scheme to enable waterfront and town centre regeneration.

Jackson has been awarded the contract to complete this key road scheme whose aim is to improve traffic flows through identified congestion points along the A20. This work will be conducted in phases to minimise disruption in the immediate vicinity.

The works will comprise of two junction improvements on the A20 at the Prince of Wales and York Street roundabouts with Mova Smart system traffic lighted junctions and improved access to Union Street. The traffic light control system for Woolcomber Street is also being upgraded.

This efficient system of traffic lights will be sequenced and has the ability to monitor, regulate and improve traffic flows. The system will reduce the potential for congested roundabouts and associated delays on the road network within the area.

Considerable planning and traffic modelling has gone into finding the best way to implement these improvement works to ensure that traffic utilising the ferry ports and the local community are able to continue with minimal disruption.



Proposed changes to Prince of Wales Roundabout

Phase 1 - Prince of Wales Roundabout

The initial phase will start on 20th February at the Prince of Wales roundabout and is anticipated to be completed by September.


Access to all local businesses and residences will be maintained throughout this time.

Phase 2 - York Street Roundabout

The next phase, the York Street roundabout, will only start once these improvements are complete. It is anticipated that works will be completed by the end of 2016.
