PROPOSED DOVER HARBOUR REVISION ORDER

NOTICE OF APPLICATION FOR A HARBOUR REVISION ORDER

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Dover Harbour Board ("the applicant") has applied to the Marine Management Organisation (MMO) for a harbour revision order under section 14 of the Harbours Act 1964.

The proposed order would confer further modernising powers on the applicant considered conducive to the efficient and economical operation, maintenance, management and improvement of Dover Harbour.

In particular, the proposed order would confer general functions on the applicant with respect to its undertaking at Dover Harbour and further powers for the development of land within or in the vicinity of the harbour, to carry on commercial activities, to grant tenancies and to dispose of land. The proposed order would also confer powers on the applicant to become a member of, or subscribe for shares or securities in, a body corporate and to delegate its functions. In addition, the proposed order would confer on the applicant or any subsidiary company of it, further powers for borrowing money for the purposes of carrying out their functions, power to establish and maintain reserve funds and to make subscriptions, payments or donations to associations, institutions or charities.

The proposed order would not authorise the construction or alteration of a project or confer development consent. Accordingly, Council Directive 85/337/EEC on the assessment of the effects of certain public and private projects on the environment (as amended) which is codified by Council Directive 2011/92/EU does not apply to the proposals and no environmental statement has been supplied.

A copy of the draft order and accompanying documents is deposited at the offices of the applicant at the Corporate Communications Office, Dover Harbour Board, Harbour House, Dover, Kent CT17 9BU. These may be inspected at all reasonable hours until the expiry of the forty-two day period referred to below.

The draft order and accompanying documents are also available for inspection at the offices of the MMO in Newcastle by appointment at the email address below or may be viewed on the MMO's website at http://www.marinemanagement.org.uk/licensing/public_register/harbour.htm

Any person desiring to make an objection or representation concerning the application should write to the Inshore Marine Licensing Team, Marine Management Organisation, Lancaster House, Hampshire Court, Newcastle Upon Tyne, NE4 7YH or email to harbourorders@marinemanagement.org.uk. An objection or representation **should**:

- i. be received before the expiry of a period of 42 days starting with the date at the foot of this notice;
- ii. be made in writing quoting reference DC9850;
- iii. state the grounds of the objection or representation;

- iv. indicate who is making the objection or representation; and
- v. give an address to which correspondence relating to the objection or representation may be sent.

The MMO will pass to the applicant a copy of any objections and other representations received.

If an objection is duly made and not withdrawn then the MMO may cause an inquiry to be held. Any objections duly made and not withdrawn and any representations duly made will be considered before the MMO decides whether or not to make the order.
